BIG INCREASE IN COLLEGE AND CAREER READINESS

ATLANTA -Westlake has earned a 73.5 score on the College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI), which is an 8.8 point increase from last year.

Please help me in congratulating our students and staff for a job well done! Teachers, thank you for investing in our students, and students, thank you for accepting the challenge.

This large increase, along with other indicators, is making us not only very competitive

in the South, but also making us definitely competitive with schools across the district.

This increase brings us within two points of the state high school average rating of 75.8. We are not where we need to be, but we are improving every year, and this year, we have improved by a huge margin.

For the past four years, the Georgia Department of Education (GADOE) has compiled graduation rates, test scores, and more to establish the CCRPI.

Before 2012, the GADOE instead used the Annual Yearly Progress metric established by No Child Left Behind and the United States Department of Education.

POETRY OUT LOUD FINALS ONLY ONE CLICK AWAY

Watch the national finals of Poetry Out Loud as students recite poems to win the \$20,000 top prize.

ATLANTA -Poetry Out Loud is a national competition where students select two poems to memorize and recite them in front of judges, who score them on both the accuracy of their recitation as well as their personal vocal interpretations.

Last year, 365,000 students in 2,300 high schools across the nation participated in Poetry Out Loud (POL), combing through a common pool of 900 poems that could be used for competition.

This year, these nearly four hundred thousand students have gone through a series of competitions at their schools, cities counties, and states, pruning the massive field until eventually 53 reciters are left. Now that the Po-

etry Out Loud Foundation has selected its 53 finalists, these talented teenagers will compete at the national competition for a the top prize of \$20,000.

The national competition will be held this week at George Washington University in Washington D.C., where students will participate in a three day long conference.

Monday, students arrive in D.C. and become acclimated with their surroundings.

Tuesday, regional competitions begin, where students are grouped into geographical sectionals (East Central & Northeast, Midwest & South Central, and Upper Midwest & West) and judges whittle the top 50 down further for a manageable final slate of nine competitors.

Wednesday, the National Finals begin, where the best of the best deliver stirring renditions of popular poetry.

Representing the state of Georgia is Marta Palombo, a senior at Cambridge High School, who rose from the ranks of those competing at the Atlanta Historical Center.

Westlake's school winner, Quion Douze, who performed Paul Laurence Dunbar's "Invitation to Love" and Stephen Dunn's "Sweetness," had high praises for Marta.

"Marta had stage presence and obviously had studied her poems. She was impressive and one of my favorite readers," said Quion.

"If it couldn't have been me, I'm glad it was her. I watched her last year, and she was great. This year, she was even

better. I'm hoping to do what she did next year and find my way to D.C."

Those who would like to join Quion in supporting Marta as she goes for the top prize can tune into the one-time only live stream and follow her rounds.

For sectionals, Marta will be competing in Midwest & South Central Semi-Final, which is the second of the three semi-finals. It will live stream on Tuesday, May 3rd at 1pm.

"If you are planning on listening or watching the competition via live streaming feed, then you will probably hear me screaming and cheering for her," said POL Georgia coordinator Emily Reece.

Ms. Reece, who put together all the competitions across the state and has been incredibly

supportive to so many young reciters from Georgia, even added her own analysis of the proceedings.

"Marta is placed towards the end of the reciting lineup, which I think is a good spot."

If Marta places in the top three for her sectional, then she will advance to the nine person final round.

"I know our Marta will do fantastically, so everyone please cheer her on and give her your support," said Ms. Reece.

The Final will take place at 7pm on Wednesday May 4th and is projected to last until 9:15pm.

POL is also pushing the National Final as a social event that can gather poetry lovers together, so if you would like to watch with a group, there are Live

Webcast Viewing Parties popping up around our community.

NATIONAL GUARD, MAXPREPS HONORS BOYS BASKETBALL CHAMPIONS

ATLANTA- The Westlake High School boys basketball team has finished number 43 nationally for the 2015 - 2016 season.

The announcement was made by MaxPreps, the online high school sports leader and a CBSsports.com site. MaxPreps ranks more than 20,000 high school boys varsity basketball teams.

Westlake (27-4) closed out the season with 12 consecutive wins as the Lions defeated Pebblebrook of Mableton 68-58 on March 5th to capture the Georgia 6A state championship, the team's first since 2002 and its third overall.

Westlake is one of 10 boys teams being honored on the 11th annual MaxPreps Tour of Champions presented by the Army National Guard, which is in its 10th year recognizing some of the best basketball teams throughout the country.

"For more than a decade, MaxPreps, in partnership with the Army National Guard, has honored the top high school sports teams in the na-

tion. Westlake High School is one of a very select and elite group of basketball teams to be honored this year," said Andy Beal, President and Founder of MaxPreps.

"We congratulate the coach, the players, and the Westlake High School community for earning the Army National Guard national ranking trophy."

"This is one of the biggest honors we've received for our basketball program and really appreciate MaxPreps and what they do for high school sports. We will do our best to live up to this honor," said Westlake head basketball coach Darron Rogers Sr., who completed his 20th season.

Junior forward Chuma Okeke led a balanced Westlake attack, averaging 20 points, eight rebounds, and three assists per game. Junior guard Daniel Lewis netted 15 points and four assists while his brother, James, a sophomore point guard, contributed 14 points, eight assists and four rebounds.

Raquan Wilks, who

will play at East Carolina University in Greenville, North Carolina next season, averaged 13 points, five rebounds, and three steals for the Lions.

Senior forward Ronald Bell contributed 10 points and seven rebounds per contest.

Junior Michael Durr, who stands at 6' 10", added six points, six rebounds, and 3.5 blocks.

6' 8" junior power forward Kevin Simeon averaged four points, three rebounds, and a pair of blocked shots.

Georgia Sergeant Sahmiah Grant presented Coach Rogers and the team with the Army National Guard national ranking trophy at a school assembly. The team also received a banner for its accomplishments.

"Courage, commitment, and unity are just a few qualities that superior athletes, along with the men and women of the Army National Guard, have in common," said Sergeant First Class Michael Semeja of the Army National Guard.

"On behalf of the Na-



tional Guard, I am privileged to recognize this nationally ranked championship team for their dedication, leadership, and teamwork."

MaxPreps uses a sophisticated computer program to determine team rank for the Tour of Champions.

The system utilizes the huge number of game results stored in the MaxPreps database.

Generally, the more a team wins, the higher the ranking, but the system takes into account quality wins (against other highly ranked opponents), margin of victory, and strength of schedule. Playoff games are weighted 2.1 times a regular season game.

SUMMARY OF GIRLS SENIOR NIGHT

ATLANTA - If you missed the girls soccer team's senior night, then you missed quite the show.

Our Lady Lions put together a dominant performance against Pebblebrook, winning by the lopsided score of 7 - 0.

Wishing you had seen this rout? Of course you

are. Have no fear, though. Below you can find a minute-by-minute breakdown of the game.

1ST HALF (GIRLS)

40' The Lady Lions fielded the pitch on a perfect spring day, with the temperature hovering around a cool 70 degrees and the breeze smooth. As the team

lined up for kick off, Westlake looked alert and active. Alexis Lawson jumped to stretch, bringing her knees to her chest, and Carina Funches made sure to bounce a few dance moves to stay loose.

38' Westlake controlled the pace of the game from the start,

playing two forwards, four midfield with one pushed up, and four flat defense. The first series was whistled offsides, but despite the infraction, the Lions had found success penetrating early with ease.

36' Westlake's defense fended off Pebblebrook thanks to a deep clear by Christen Jones that landed perfectly for Lawson, who hungrily took it all the way to the penalty box before getting tripped up. On Pebblebrook's clear, Lawson earned the ball back, giving a stern pass into the box to Kamryen Laster, but Pebblebrook's defense stepped up to break up the play, giving Westlake a corner kick.

35' Jones took a big boot to the ball, putting a shot on goal from thirty yards out, missing the left post by only a foot and a half. The kick was at least twelve feet out of the box, which showed Jones's range. Westlake kept pressing, and Leona Richards registered another shot on goal, nudging the ball with the back of her heel off a corner kick from the left side. The goalie, however, was not fooled by the trick shot and scooped up the ball.

34' Lawson took the ball with strength up the

right side of the field, finding daylight as well as Westlake's third shot on goal. Lawson had a good strike from ten yards out, but it went just wide to the right.

33' On the next play, Pebblebrook crossed midfield but was stopped by Sariya Mathis who stepped up into space to reclaim the ball. After a failed penalty shot from well outside the box, Westlake returned to putting pressure on the goal.

30' Mathis pushed it through Pebblebrook's backfield, forcing the defense to kick it out of bounds, earning her a chance for a corner kick, which resulted in a scrum in front of the goal but no big moment for Westlake.

29' However, in the next minute, Laster put a strong shot on goal that was cleaned up by number Lauren McKinney, who pierced the right side of the net to give Westlake its first goal. (*Westlake 1 - 0*)

27' With building momentum, Jones stole the ball and then used fancy footwork to get around the player in front of her. Seeing an opportunity downfield, Jones passed to Laster, who raced down the field, staying two steps

ahead of two defenders in hot pursuit. Laster then put a precision shot into the left side that froze the goalie so fully that she did not even commit to guess because she knew there was no hope. (*Westlake 2 - 0*)

25' In the wake of Westlake's second goal, Pebblebrook made a mental mistake, committing a handball, but Westlake was in great spirits, evidenced by great hustle from McKinney, who broke up a Pebblebrook series and hustled to the sideline to make sure Westlake maintained possession.

24' Thanks to the hustle of McKinney, Lawson received the clear in space and outran the defense. Lawson made it look easy as she waltzed to the goal and put it into the left corner, giving Westlake its third goal in five minutes. (*Westlake 3 - 0*)

22' At this point, Westlake's momentum took over, and the girls looked unstoppable. In fact, McKinney showed her expert skill, handling the ball and playing it backward in a smart play. Lawson ran down the pass to keep it. The backpass opened up Lawson, who again caused trouble for Pebblebrook's defense by



running down the ball before it crossed the sideline. Then, Lawson kicked it hard from the side, netting her second of the game. (*Westlake 4 - 0*)

21' The goals were coming fast and easy for Westlake, which did not let down on the other side of the field. In fact, Roschelle Thornwell showed that the defense matched the offense when she slidtackled an advancing Pebblebrook forward to prevent a good shot on goal, perhaps maintaining the shutout.

20' McKinney with extreme speed streaked down the right side with a chance for a good shot, but her touch was a bit too hard and the dribble went long. Pebblebrook's goalie scooped up the ball before McKinney could pull the trigger.

19' Pebblebrook finally found a bit of life and put together an impressive series, but they squandered it with a bad pass that posed no threat to Westlake's first half shut out.

14' Carina with a chip that Alexis brought down with a header to space. Without much help, Alexis battled for a corner that was spat back out to Alexis, who tried again, sending another long arc into the box that was almost headed by Carina, who ended up about a foot short with the header, throwing up her hand instead and gaining a handball. You can't blame her desire, but Carina, you know you can't use your hands, right?

9' Between the 14th and 9th minutes, the

play was sloppy for both teams, but Westlake maintained control. Funches in particular kept the progress moving forward with hard-nosed play and tremendous play.

8' Westlake's first scare occurred when an opponent slidtackled number Mathis, who stayed down for an alarming few seconds, but she popped back up to deliver first a throw and then a deep kick to the other side of the field, where Hall set up a cross for a crashing Laster, but it was just a bit too close to the goalie.

7' Westlake's defense shined in the waning minutes of the first half. It seemed that any time the opponent worked it down the field, Shina Smith was there to stop them in their tracks with a big stand.

6' 4 stood out for her hustle, winning the ball at midfield in aggressive fashion and dishing it to McKinney. McKinney forced it pass the goalie, who got a hand on it but could not handle the hard shot. (*Westlake 5 - 0*)

5' Despite their lead, Westlake stayed aggressive. Alexis, ready to add another goal, hit a towering chip from the right sideline that looked for a moment like it might drop in the goal but soared just past the top bar.

4' Pebblebrook's frustration started to show as Kylah Ellsberry received abuse on the sideline but stood strong, forcing the ball out, trading elbows and small shoves but staying largely above the fray.

2' Lawson put on a show in the final minutes of the first half, passing the ball past a trio of defenders and then speeding past them to pick up her own pass. Then, Lawson drew the goalie out of the goal, cut right, pulled the ball back when challenged by a defender, and put a strong shot on goal. After the shot ricocheted, Alexis gained control again and almost found a teammate on the far side of the goal, but they missed the connection. Never-the-less, it was highlight reel material.

1' Just when Pebblebrook thought they were in the clear, Laster jumped in the middle of Pebblebrook's small ball passing game and intercepted the ball, converting it to a shot on goal that went wide of the left post by just six inches. With that, the clock expired and the Lions went into halftime up 5 - 0.

2ND HALF (GIRLS)

37' Much of the success for Westlake in the first half was due to players stepping up into space, a fact that became all the more apparent when Shenelle Edwards started the half with smart play, stepping up, going around her opponent, and stealing the ball.

36' When Pebblebrook recovered the ball, they looked to have a fast break, but Shina slowed down the run on the left side, and Rochelle Thornwell crossed fields to support, stopping the threat and clearing the ball. Not to be outdone, in the next minute, Laster stole the

ball twice, forming a solid wall that could not be passed.

35' Edwards returned the favor to Laster and stole the ball, passing it up to Laster who had certainly earned being the recipient. Laster then sent it to crowd favorite Funches, who was speedy as a forward but sent the shot on goal wide to the right, reacting flamboyantly in a style befitting a FIFA video game.

34' Funches got another opportunity as strike but was brought down twenty yards from the goal line. Funches provided some entertainment in the beginning of the second half, combining aggressive play with opportunities to impress.

32' The next few minutes reduced to solid play from Thornwell, who worked a good triangle pass with Edwards and Jones, eliciting a comment from one young lady in the crowd who yelled, "They're playing good today!"

31' Westlake knocked at the door of opportunity thanks to a shot on goal from Lawson and another from McKinney two minutes later.

28' McKinney then followed up her shot with one just above the crossbar. When Pebblebrook set up a goal kick, Dominique Earle played zone and trapped a goal kick with her thigh, bringing the ball to her feet. Earle then fired a pass to McKinney, who ran the ball up the left side and passed it straight in front of the goal, hitting Lawson in stride. Lawson, the con-

summate professional, put the ball into the back on the net for the hat trick. (*Westlake 6 - 0*)

26' Laster took a strong shot on goal, and while wearing number Laster, she narrowly missed making it 7 - 0.

23' The McKinney - Lawson connected remained fruitful when McKinney penetrated the left side of the field and sent a cross inches from a crashing Lawson, who had so much momentum that she wound up in the netting of the goal. This was not the first near miss on an impressive cross and left the crowd wowed by their communication and timing.

21' McKinney almost came away with another big play when Lauryn showed her speed in a dead sprint, arcing around two defenders, making them look still. However, the goalie was able to stop her rocket shot, preventing her from further boosting her stats line.

18' Funches and McKinney stayed hungry, battling their way deep into the box, earning Westlake a corner. The corner went a bit wide and came out beyond the box, where Lawson began battling for possession.

17' Lawson was pulled down, and a yellow card was assigned to Lawson after the play perhaps for her visible frustration with having been pulled down.

16' McKinney tried to set up Lawson for vengeance via scoring, but Lawson's shot on goal was straight to the goalie, who scooped it up

safely.

15' It was not long before McKinney was back in the mix, bringing the ball into the box and keeping the goalie on her toes with a strong shot on goal that ricocheted out of bounds, giving Westlake a corner kick.

11' Minutes later, Lawson woke the crowd up from being lulled into a gentle back and forth when she dramatically stole it, dribbled it around the defenders, breaking the ankles of two different players, and made her way to the goal where she took the more difficult choice to go to the other side. Although the shot did not score, Lawson left even the other team impressed with the skills she showed while opening up the opportunity.

5' The game seemed to take a slower pace when two different opponents went down with injuries, apparently having become a bit sore and cramped at the end of the game.

4' Westlake, however, was not satisfied and had time for one more goal. McKinney performed a magic trick, working the ball around the defenders, pulling them to the far right side of the box, and then bending the ball past them into the deep left corner of the goal. (*Westlake 7 - 0*)

1' As time wound to a zero on the scoreboard, Westlake's girls had put on a dominant fireworks display of teamwork, defensive stands, and offensive tenacity. The afternoon was all Westlake! **W**

SUMMARY OF BOYS SENIOR NIGHT

1ST HALF (BOYS)

When the Westlake boys soccer team faced Pebblebrook, they knew it would be an uphill battle against the toughest team in the region.

In fact, Pebblebrook eventually ended their season ranked 8th in the nation and 3rd in the state of Georgia due to their 14 - 1 record.

After winning fourteen straight games, Pebblebrook dropped only their last game of the season 2 - 1 in a fluky game against Wheeler.

Westlake played Pebblebrook strongly, leading early in the game, showing that Westlake can play with anyone, but eventually Pebblebrook found a way back

into the game, and in the last minutes of the game, ran up the score to an unreflective 5 - 1.

36' In the first four minutes of the game, Westlake made quite the statement. After a few short passes in the mouth of the goal, Andy Baskin put it in the net, putting Westlake ahead by one early in the game.

(Westlake 1 - 0)

34' Pebblebrook, hungry to equal the score, pushed the ball up the field and fired a rocket shot to what seemed to be an open spot in the goal, but keeper Quincy Turner-Bryant laid out to block the ball on a monster save.

33' When the ball came out on into space, Westlake aggressively stepped forward to control the midfield. Keith Slaughter in particular gave full hustle, sprawling out to keep possession of the ball, which set up a free kick by Edson dos Santos from the 25 yards out that looked promising but was easily handled by the goalie.

32' Looking alive, Jermarcus Black did not give up the ball, and when Pebblebrook's goalie dished it to the defense, Black stole it from the defender in the corner, setting up another free kick from dos Santos that almost turned into a goal scoring header. Westlake officially had Pebblebrook on its heels, reeling from the near goal.

31' Santiago Martinez kept the pressure up, getting a great steal in the midfield, bringing the crowd and Westlake's players alive with his play.

30' In fact, Martinez followed up his steal on the very next play when he hit the ball backward with a fancy flick of his

heel, showing excellent defense and skill and notching his second steal in as many minutes.

29' Westlake's pace escalated further as Zidane Bogle ran hard to win the ball in space, and Westlake had successfully dominated the game for the first ten minutes of the game.

28' Pebblebrook evened the score, however, with amazing shot that was 35 yards out and placed in the top right hand corner. There was nothing that the leaping Turner-Bryant could do about that one.

It was a professional grade shot from the distance of a field goal but with plenty of heat and precision. (Pebblebrook 1 - 1)

27' Again, Martinez kept Westlake's spirits high with a great steal and pass to Baskin, who was immediately roughly fouled, eliciting a conversation between the referee and Pebblebrook's player, which was essentially a warning in lieu of a card. The referee then spent much more time with two Westlake player, including the one who was fouled, warning them.

24' Westlake showed another flash of brilliance when Slaughter put a deep pass to Baskin, showing great teamwork, but it was sadly broken up by Pebblebrook's quick defense.

21' Westlake's defense had a momentary

lapse, and Pebblebrook's forward broke coverage, working his way within five yards of the goal for a one-on-one shot for the keeper, but Akil Russell slid from out of nowhere to take the shot away, providing much needed heroics to ensure the game remained tied. The crowd rose to their feet at this point, amazed at the play of Russell.

19' Playing with spirit, Russell broke up another play on the left sideline, fighting hard and eventually getting called for fighting a bit too hard with his elbows.

18' Pebblebrook took the set kick from the penalty and got within scoring range, putting a shot on goal into the right corner, but Turner-Bryant went low and to the right side to prevent the well-placed shot.

16' The highlight reel rolled on the field thanks to Black, who juggled like a mad fiend, and Russell, who performed a solid steal to maintain possession.

14' Showing his speed, dos Santos cut inside the defense, got into the opponent's goalie box, shot it to the keeper, who bobbled the ball, almost giving Westlake an opportunity.

13' Inspired by the near goal, dos Santos followed it up with a faked trap to let the ball go through his legs to number Black, who penetrated again but found opposition in Pebble-

brook's defense.

11' Turner-Bryant again played hero with a great low save and then a good conservative scoop when Pebblebrook won back the ricochet.

10' Turner-Bryant again was tried when Pebblebrook had a breakaway, but Turner-Bryant ran forward to the side, sliding to break up the Pebblebrook advance. It was a risky but necessary play, but when the ball came loose, Pebblebrook regained possession and tried to take advantage as Turner-Bryant scrambled back to the goal, but Morgan Kidd had filled the vacuum when Turner-Bryant came forward. Kidd stood the line and blocked Pebblebrook's shot with his thigh, showing extreme flexibility, before it could cross the line for a goal.

8' Pebblebrook did not give up, and in a star play, dribbled through several Westlake players and placed a shot from twenty yards out into the top left corner of the goal. There was nothing that Turner-Bryant, who had been spectacular all game, could have done. In fact, a goalie would have to have been 7' 2" to block that shot. (*Pebblebrook 2 - 1*)

6' As the time winded down in the first half, Bogle controlled the midfield, seeming to be everyone when a play needed to be made.

5' In an act of desperation to make a goal happen, Baskin ran down a ball as it sailed into the goalie box, creating a jump ball scenario between him and the keeper. Baskin went up high and hard, knocking the ball loose from the goalkeeper, earning himself a yellow card. On the next play, Baskin answered back, keeping the energy high but clean, taking a ball to the left side and almost willing his way into the goal.

1' As time expired, Turner-Bryant made an yet another amazing save to preserve the 2 - 1 score into the half, and both teams knew that it could be anybody's game.

2ND HALF (BOYS)

40' The start of the second half was delayed for about five minutes, and eventually word made it up to the stands that the referees were holding the beginning of the second half because they had been yelled from the stands at for controversial calls in the first half.

38' When the game did start, Westlake worked the ball down to the Pebblebrook side with confidence, and Slaughter put a ground burner to the goalie and then kept it pinned onto the other half with monster headers in the midfield.

35' Kidd broke up a good Pebblebrook run by

sticking his foot in the way and reversing possession.

34' Pebblebrook committed hard contact in the penalty box that knocked Westlake's forward to the ground and prevented his shot, but the apparent foul was not called by the referee, who again stopped the game when the crowd questioned the no call.

29' Five minutes later, Martinez broke up a possible chance to score for Pebblebrook, reducing the opportunity to a corner kick. Turner-Bryant fended off the first two or three shots on goal, but Pebblebrook got too many chances on ricochets and eventually hit a ground burner that snuck past defenders and into the net. (*Pebblebrook 3 - 1*)

25' Kidd, resolved to not let another goal happen, defended strongly, knocking out a dangerous ball with one of Westlake's best clears of the game.

23' Turner-Bryant wowed the crowd with a towering punt that went about 50 yards, bringing up the question if he would soon start punting for the football team.

20' dos Santos's hustle went to the next level, challenging every ball for what seemed like a stretch of four to five minutes. Throughout this stretch, Westlake played on despite shoves and jersey pulling.

19' dos Santos penetrated from the side and gave the ball a good strike, but it was handled by the goalie.

18' In a rare turn of events, the referee stopped the game to card Westlake's coach, who apparently was upset at the non-calls. When the game restarted, Westlake played with vigor, especially 2, who stopped the ball on a great defense play.

16' Again, Turner-Bryant turned in a great save to the right to keep the game close.

9' Eventually, after much Pebblebrook pressure, they eventually added another goal. (*Pebblebrook 4 - 1*)

8' Turner-Bryant had another great save within the last ten minutes.

6' However, Pebblebrook added another goal by header after Westlake had left the near post empty. (*Pebblebrook 5 - 1*)

1' It was clear the wheels had fallen off in the last fifteen minutes, but Westlake played well with heart and skill, hanging with the region champs for the majority of the game.

Congratulations to both the girls and the boys soccer team, both of whom stepped up during their senior night to show the stuff that makes up Westlake. **W**
